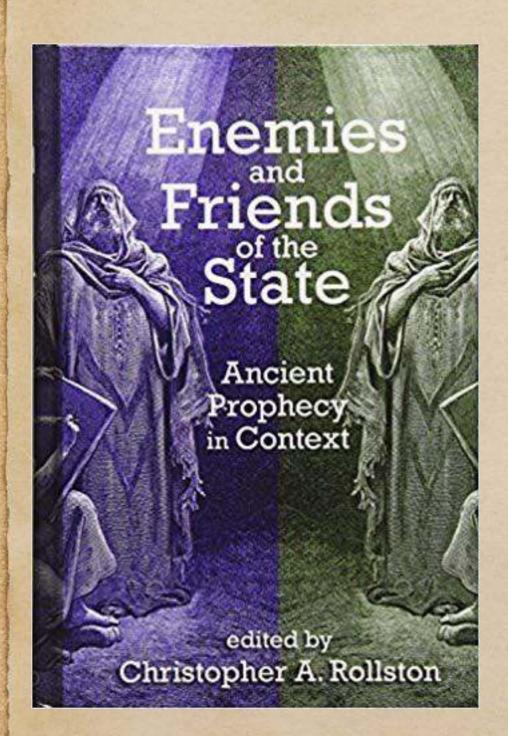

John 3:22 After this Jesus and his disciples went into the land of Judea; there he remained with them and baptized. 23 John also was baptizing at Aenon near Salim, because there was much water there; and people came and were baptized. 24 For John had not yet been put in prison.

Mark 1:14 Now <u>after John was arrested</u> Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel."

John 10:40 He went away again across the Jordan to the place where John at first baptized, and there he remained. 41 And many came to him; and they said, "John did no sign, but everything that John said about this man was true." 42 And many believed in him there.

Jesus said to them, "I will ask you a question; answer me, and I will tell you by what authority I do these things. 30 Was the baptism of John from heaven or from men? Answer me." 31 And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say, 'Why then did you not believe him?' 32 But shall we say, 'From men'?" — they were afraid of the people, for all held that John was a real prophet. 33 So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And Jesus said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things."

Luke 11:1 He was praying in a certain place, and when he ceased, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." 2 And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. 3 Give us each day our daily bread; 4 and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive every one who is indebted to us; and lead us not into temptation."

Luke 7:24 When the messengers of John had gone, he began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to behold? A reed shaken by the wind? 25 What then did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft clothing? Behold, those who are gorgeously appareled and live in luxury are in kings' courts. 26 What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. 27 This is he of whom it is written, 'Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, who shall prepare thy way before thee.' 28 I tell you, among those born of women none is greater than John; yet he who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." 29 (When they heard this all the people and the tax collectors justified God, having been baptized with the baptism of John; 30 but the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected the purpose of God for themselves, not having been baptized by him.)

Luke 7:31 "To what then shall I compare the men of this generation, and what are they like? 32 They are like children sitting in the market place and calling to one another, 'We piped to you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not weep.' 33 For John the Baptist has come <u>eating no bread and drinking no wine</u>; and you say, 'He has a demon.' 34 The Son of man has come eating and drinking; and you say, 'Behold, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' 35 Yet wisdom is justified by all her children."

Matt. 3:13 kThen Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by nim. 14 mJohn would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" 15 But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."

Then he consented. ¹⁶ And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, ^othe heavens were opened to him, and he Psaw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; ¹⁷ and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son," with whom I am well pleased."

Mark 1:9 'In those days Jesus scame from Nazaroth of Galilec and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 And when he came up out of the water, immediately he tsaw "the heavens being torn open "and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. 11 And wa voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son;" with you I am well pleased."

baptized, and when all the people were baptized, and when "Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, "the heavens were opened, "22 and "the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and "a voice came from heaven, 9" You are my beloved Son; " with you I am well pleased."

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light...John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me.'"... For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

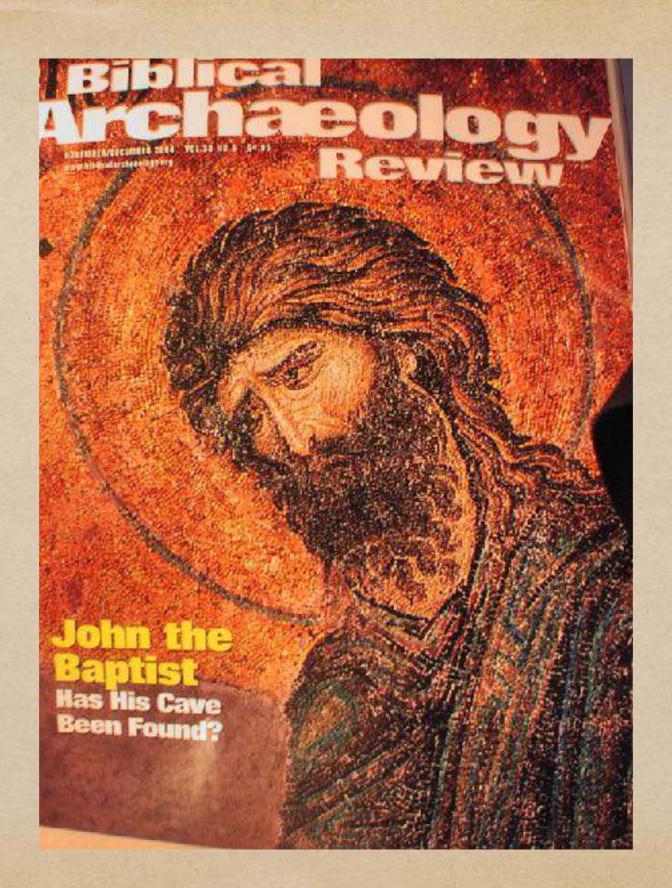
John the Baptizer plays an exalted role: Matt 11:11 "Truly, I say to you, among all those born of women men has risen greater than John the Baptizer." Phrase "yet he who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he" is missing. In the Lucan parallel (7:28), mss. 5, 475* and 1080* also omit the qualification.

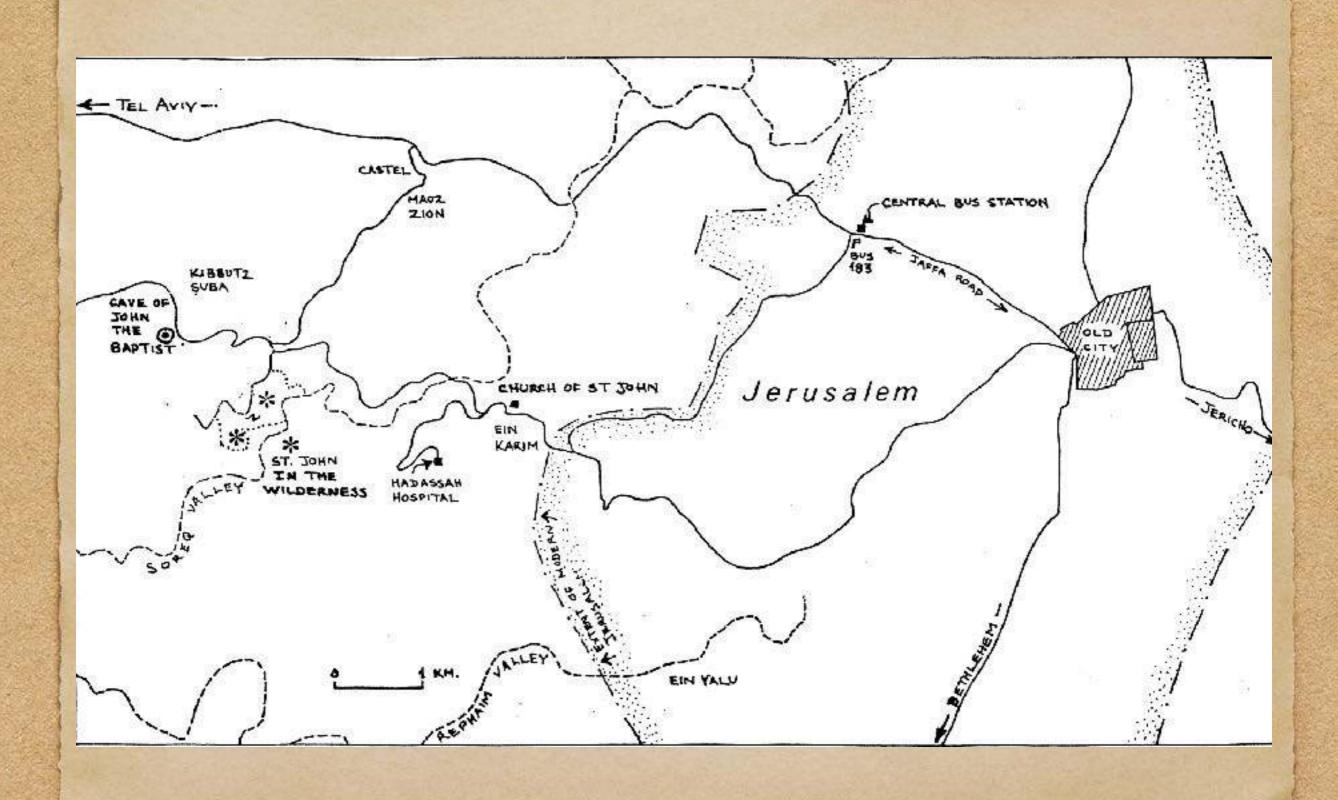
Matt 11:13 "For all the prophets and the law spoke <u>concerning</u> John" in contrast to the Greek: "For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John."

Matt 17:11 "Indeed Elijah will come and will save all the world" in contrast to the Greek: "Elijah does come, and he is to restore all things."

Matt 21:32 "Because John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him. But violent men and harlots believed him and you saw it and did not turn in repentance. Also afterward you did not repent to believe him. To the one who has ears to hear let him hear in disgrace." These words are directed to his disciples (v. 28), not to the chief priests and elders as in the Synoptic Greek tradition.

The kind of polemic found in the Gospel of John appears to be directed toward an evaluation of John the Baptizer such as that found in ST Matthew.



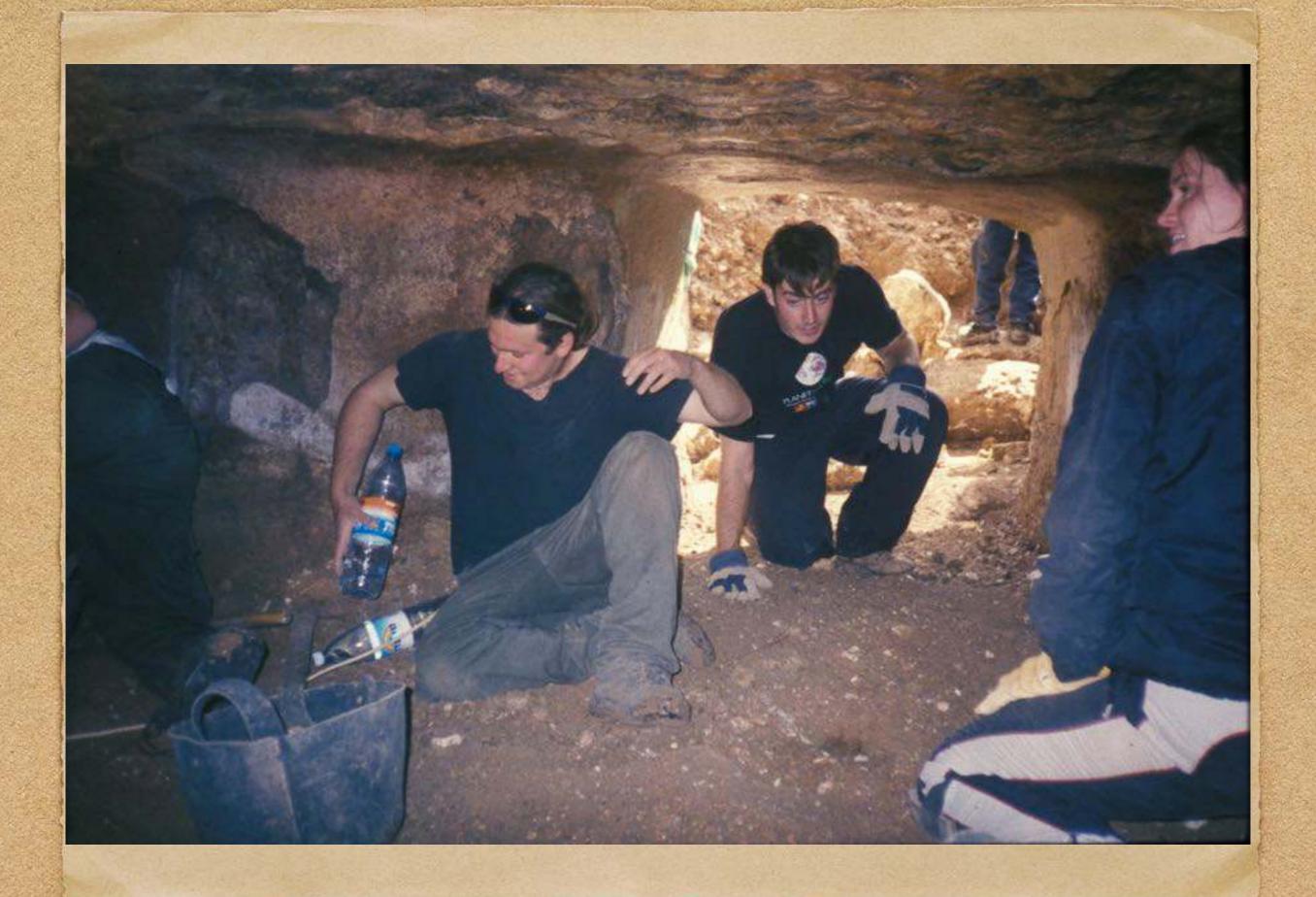






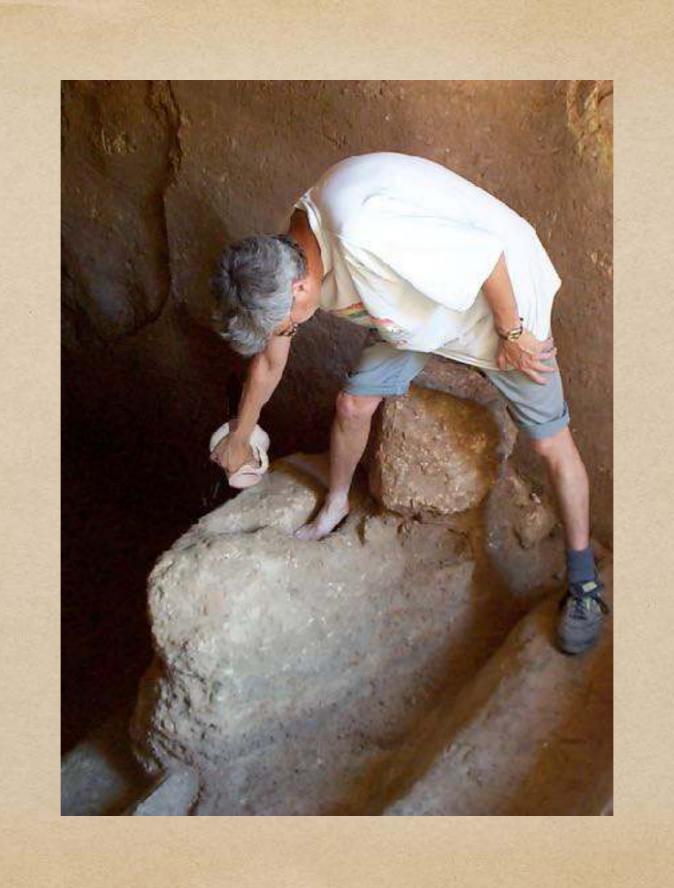






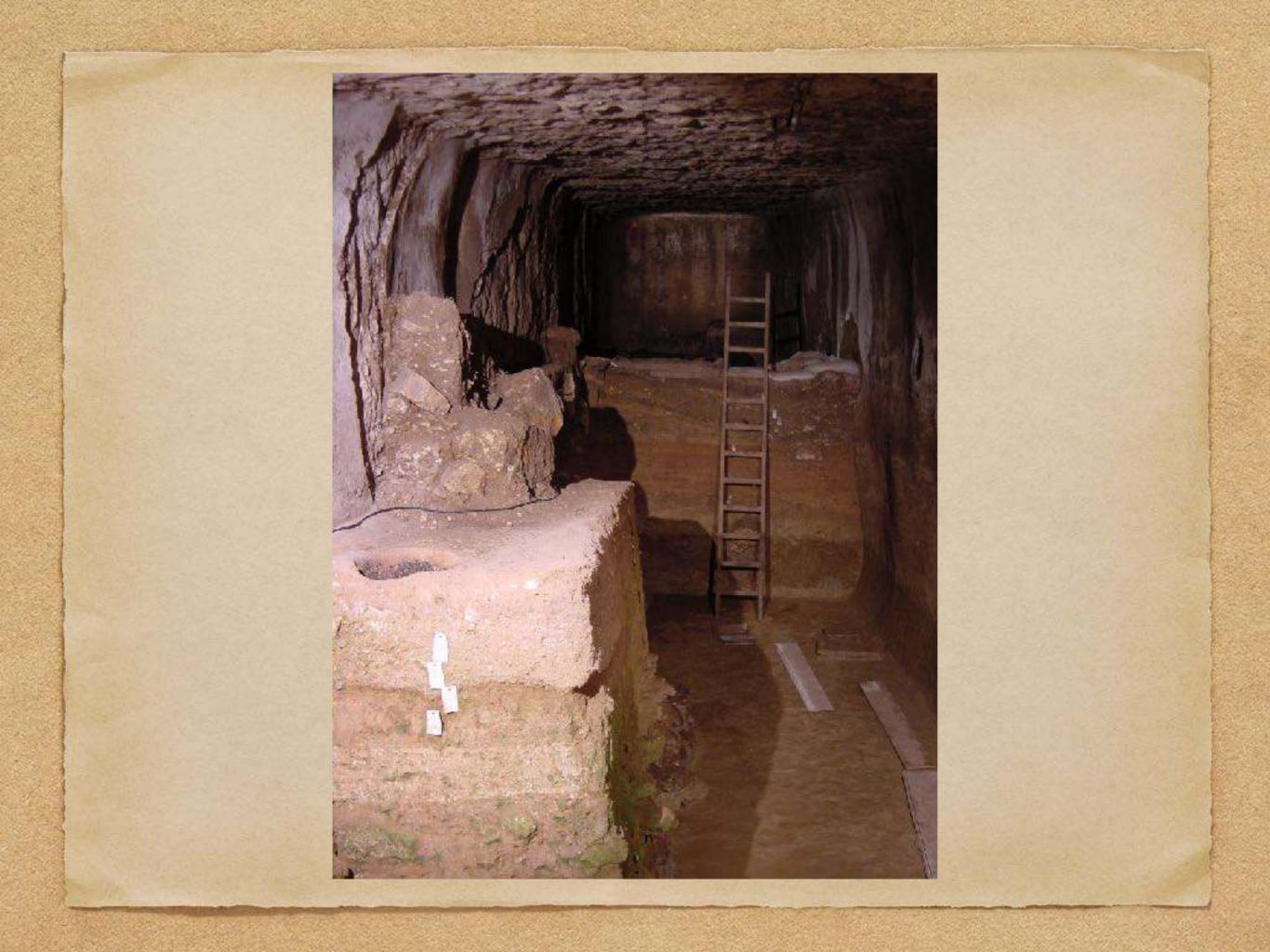


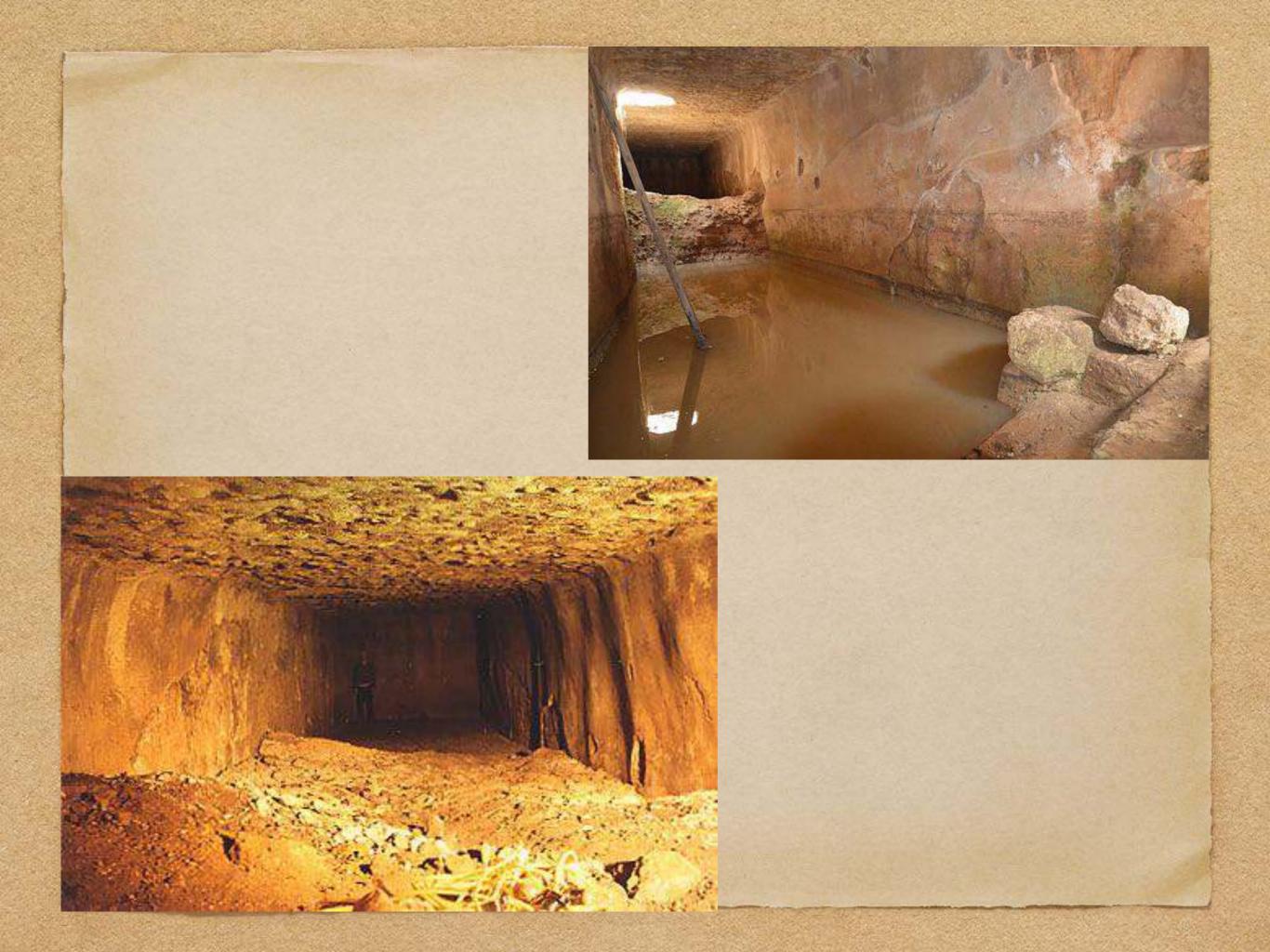


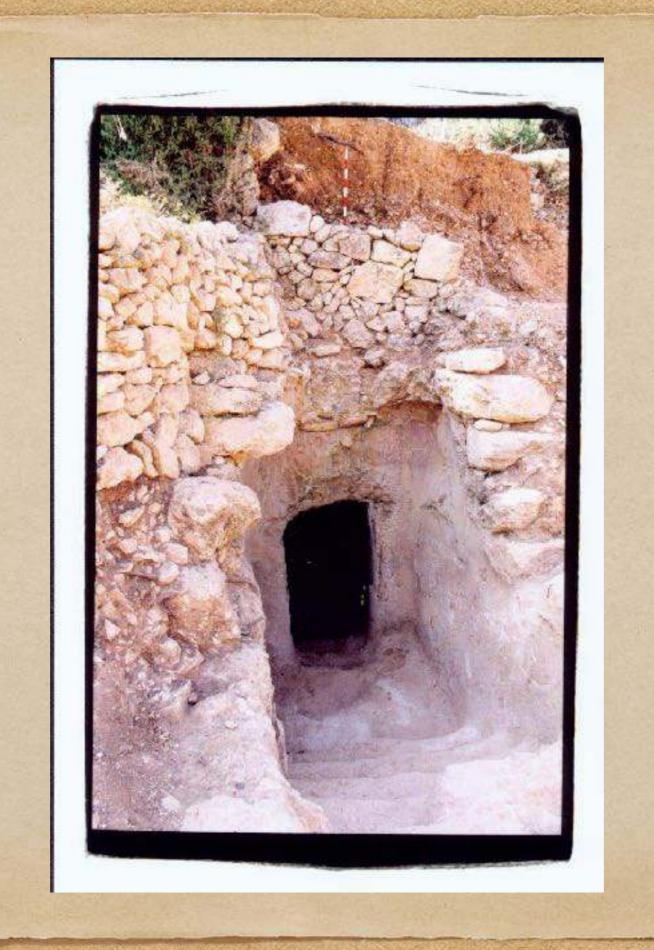








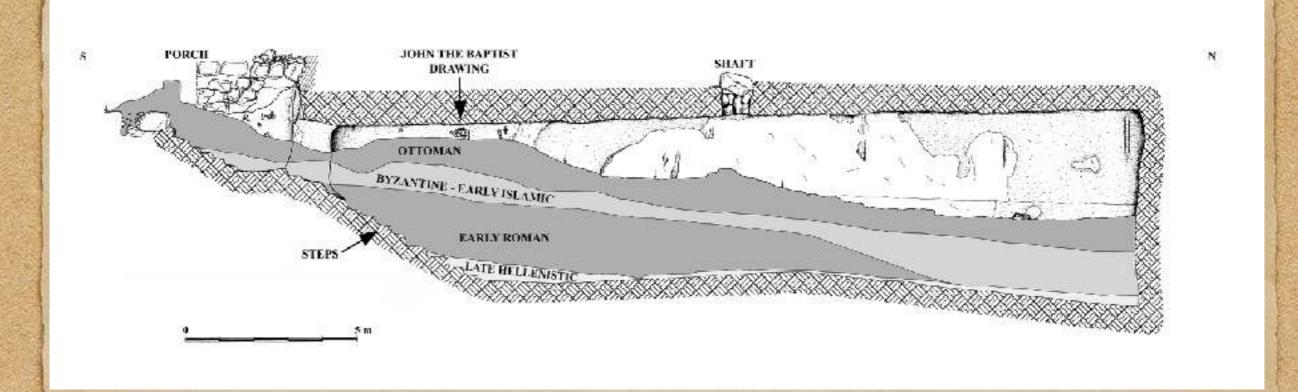


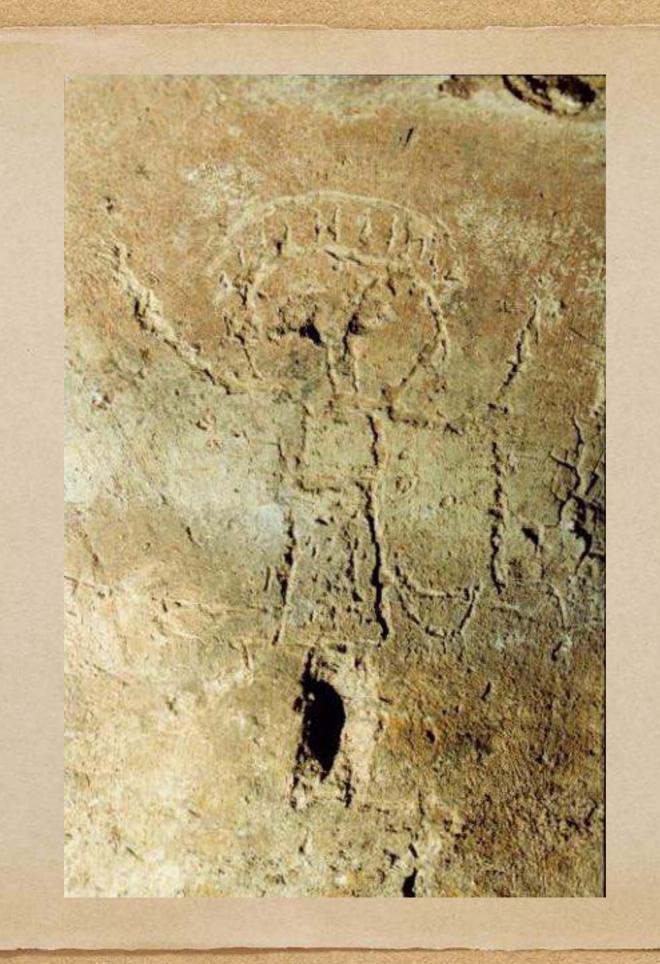


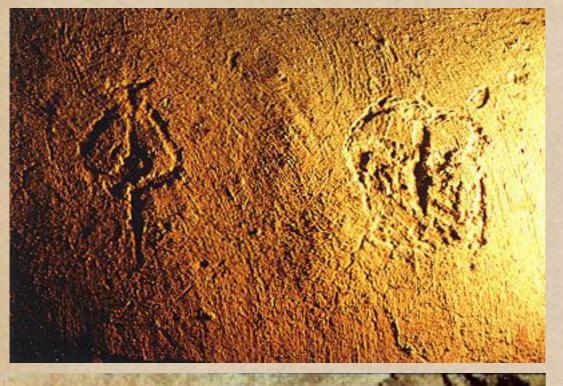

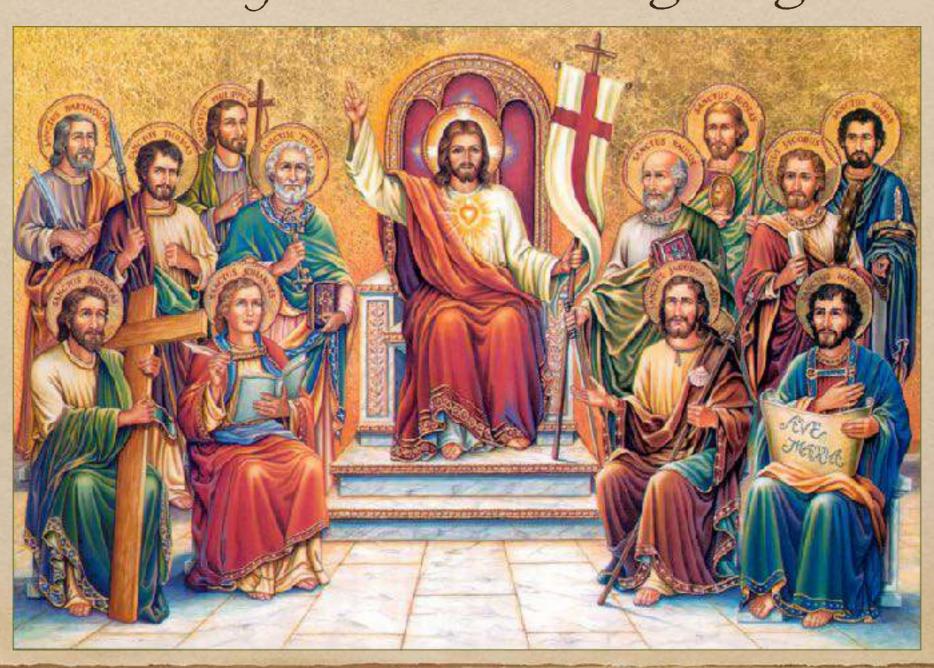






Lecture Nine:

Nicene Creed 325 CE Constantinople Additions 381 CE



I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

Lecture Ten: Will the Real Paul Please Stand Up?



Paul and Jesus: Four Fundamental Affirmations

- 1) Paul never met Jesus. Paul's sole claims to authority were his clairvoyant, visionary experiences, including his "sightings" or apparitions of Jesus.
- 2) From a historical point of view it is Paul not Jesus who might rightly be called the founder of Christianity. What most people identify as Christianity—including both the Apostles and Nicene Creeds, reflect more of Paul than the teachings of Jesus.
- 3) The entire New Testament, including the four Gospels and the book of Acts that present the life and teaching of Jesus and the history of early Christianity, are written long after Paul's letters and are heavily influenced by Paul. Reading the N.T. backwards.
- 4) Paul is arguably the most influential human being in history; his ideas continue to shape how we think about most everything. He is not always the originator but he is often the main conduit: "The Bible tells me so."
